


## 4 A January Happening



### 7 Service Times


Please note that there are two services next Sunday, 24 December, 9am and 7pm. For Sunday 31st December and all Sundays in January, there will only be one morning Service at 9am

Cathy & Michael T recently spent just short of two weeks in Cambodia on a volunteer trip with the charity Cows for Cambodia. We had many enriching



experiences including a day on the farm where Michael assisted in pregnancy testing some cows before the first 5 pregnant cows tested were immediately trucked off to needy families where they would look after the cow and then keep the resulting calf. We also, helped build a house for a very grateful family, fed more than 300 children at a school, looked after children on their school excursion at a local water park, fed another lot of children at a village and delivered rice to almost two hundred families in a very poor village. We are very grateful for the donations from the St Luke's family to the charity that in turn has helped many Cambodian families. #### 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 NIV

May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do it.

#### John 1:6-8,19-28 NIV

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

#### John the Baptist Denies Being the Messiah

Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Messiah."

They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No."

Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"

Now the Pharisees who had been sent questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"

"I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie."

This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
